Who Can Participate in Youth Assistance?

Youth who reside in the city of Westland between the ages of 9-16 who may be engaging in negative behaviors such as:

- School and home truancy
- Incurability
- School suspension and/or failing grades
- Curfew violation
- Retail fraud
- Associating with negative peers

Youth can be referred by a school, a parent, law enforcement, juvenile court, and other local agencies.

Youth and families enrolled in our program participate in the following activities:

- Life Choices peer group sessions
- Parent Support/Education Group*
- Community Service
- Guest Speaker Presentations
- HIV/AIDS Awareness & teen pregnancy prevention workshop
- Case Management
- Random Drug testing
- Mentorship
- Referrals and/or Alternative Services

- Free Karate lessons
- College visits
- Free Academic Enrichment Program
