WHEREAS, individuals and families should be encouraged and supported to uphold their cultural tenets and practices under the extant laws of the land; and

WHEREAS, nobody has the right to discriminate against any person or group of persons in the City of Westland because of their cultural identity, affiliation, inclination or expression;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND KNOWN THAT:
